



Six Dots: A Story of Young Louis Braille



The inspiring story of a blind boy so determined to read he invented his own alphabet.

Louis Braille lost his sight at age five, but he was a clever boy and was determined to live as others did. What he wanted more than anything else was to read and write. He went to the Royal School for the Blind in Paris, but there were no books he could read. At age twelve, he learned of the military's use of "night writing." It was a crude system of fingertip-read messages that was so difficult the other boys in school gave up trying to master it. But Louis persevered. Over the next three years he worked tirelessly to refine and improve the system until he had developed his own alphabet—using just six dots. At age fifteen, Louis had invented a system for reading and writing that is still used by the blind community around the world today.

My Own Book!

What you'll need: two paper bags, hole-puncher, ribbons, colorful markers, stickers

- 1 Fold the paper bags separately, and then stack them, with both of the folded ends together.
- Punch three or four holes into the folded side, and tie ribbons through the holes to keep the bags together.

Make Your Name in Braille


What you'll need: Braille alphabet, computer access, index cards, markers, nail polish

- 1 Find the dot-pattern of your name in Braille, by going to the American Foundation for the Blind website: braillebug.afb.org /thenamegame.asp.
- 2 Sketch the Braille translation of your name onto an index card.
- 3 Drip very small blobs of nail polish over the alphabet dots, and write your name at the bottom with a marker.






This spare, charming picture book about a day in the life of a pill bug in suburbia is also a book about an unusual child/bug friendship.

Personal Penguins


What you'll need: glue, scissors, a toilet paper roll, black marker, googly eyes, white, black, orange and yellow paper

- Color the toilet paper roll black.
- Cut out an oval of white paper, and glue it near the bottom of the toilet paper roll for the stomach.
- Paste on the googly eyes.
- Cut out a small orange triangle for the beak, two medium yellow triangles for the feet, two large black triangles for the arms, and paste them all on.
- Stand up your penguin, and use it for an interactive storytime!





Frog Hats

What you'll need: green foam board, green paper, scissors, pipe cleaners, marker, googly eyes

- 1 Cut the green foam board into strips about 2½ inches wide, and cut small holes in the ends.
- Push a pipe cleaner through each hole, and fold the end back to create a hook; make sure it fits around your head!
- 3 Cut out circles for the eyes using the construction paper, and make sure they are larger than your googly eyes.
- Glue the googly eyes to the green circles, and then glue the eyes to the top of your headband, making sure they extend up past the headband. Draw on a little nose.
- Sead I Don't Want to Be Big with your new frog hat!



Snowy Day Snowflakes

What you'll need: Q-tips, silver glitter, glue, scissors, pipe cleaners, colorful paper, tape

- 1 Cut Q-tips into short and long pieces.
- Put a variety of short and long strips of glue on the paper in the shape of a snowflake—almost touching in the middle—and place the Q-tips on the glue.
- 3 Put glue on the Q-tips, and sprinkle with glitter.
- Once everything is dry, cut the paper around the snowflake, and tape a bent pipe cleaner to the back to hang it up!
