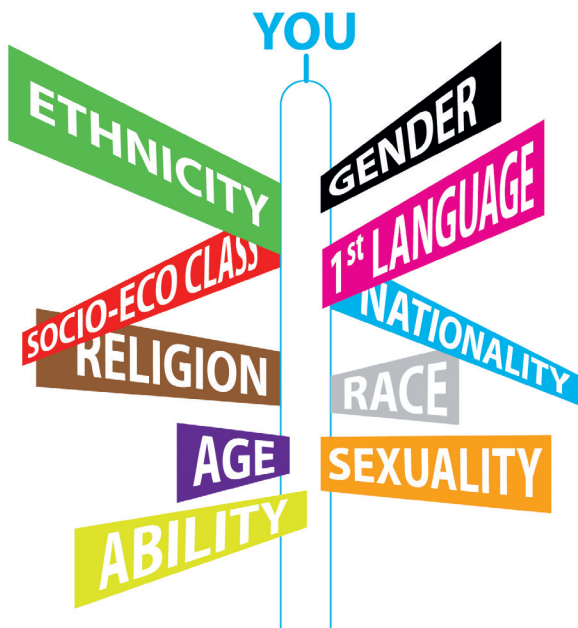
1. \_\_\_\_\_ is an inclusive acronym for all gender identities and sexualities.

8. The \_\_\_\_\_ is America's largest organization advocating for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer equality while educating the public on LGBTQIA+ issues.
9. \_\_\_\_\_ is a political theory supporting equality of the sexes, often advocating for equal pay, respect, and opportunity for all people, regardless of gender.

1. Experiencing romantic attraction. This attraction can exist with or without sexual desires.
2. A person who identifies as two genders (not limited to the gender binary)—a combination of male, female, and/or another gender identity.
3. Being attracted to two genders. Often, but not limited to, being attracted to the same gender and other gender.
4. Outward expression—such as appearance, behaviors, and attitudes—that communicates a person’s identity to society.
5. The internal understanding of one’s gender and the self. This identity may or may not correlate with one’s assigned sex at birth and may not be directly correlated to one’s outward gender expression.
6. Denoting the vast and dynamic representation of masculine characteristics, regardless of gender.
7. A name chosen by an individual that differs from their given name at birth. In the LGBTQIA+ community, a chosen name often helps in affirming an individual’s gender identity and expression.
8. A consensual relationship based on power and role-play, where one partner acts as the Dominant and one as the submissive. This relationship may be both sexual and nonsexual in nature.
9. Denoting the vast and dynamic representation of feminine characteristics, regardless of gender.
10. A way to write “folks” that implies inclusivity and celebrates queerness.
11. Total, intergenerational, culturally diverse inclusion within the LGBTQIA+ community across gender and sexuality spectrums.
12. A neighborhood primarily made up of LGBTQIA+ residences, businesses, and entertainment.
13. Describing a person who is predominantly heterosexual but is open to experiencing gay or queer relationships and sexual encounters. This person is not likely to identify as bisexual.
14. A term that addresses the problems of privilege and erasure within the LGBTQIA+ community as its members intersect with race, capitalism, sexism, transmisogyny, and cissexism.
15. To incorrectly use a gendered term or pronoun for someone.
16. A gender identity that is open to a full spectrum of gender expressions, not limited by masculinity and femininity.
17. Openly LGBTQIA+.
18. A sexual orientation where a person is attracted to people of all—“pan” is a prefix meaning “all”—genders and sexualities.
19. A medication used to reduce the risk of contracting the Human Immunodeficiency Virus in people who have not been previously exposed and/or at risk.
20. Similar to sexual orientation, this term allows people to identify who they are romantically attracted to. The term “affectional orientation” is also used.
21. Having a progressive, open attitude toward sex, sexuality, and sexual diversity.
22. A commonly used acronym for the transgender, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming communities.

# DIVERSITY & SENSITIVITY CHART:

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This chart is a guide to understanding diversity and inclusivity. It is important to use language that is respectful, affirming, and empowering to the LGBTQIA+ community. The terms and definitions that are referenced below provide readers with a basic knowledge on how to communicate in a more diverse and sensitive manner. Some words also show the impact of harmful actions that hinder the evolution of the LGBTQIA+ community. This guide is to educate and elevate our society as a whole.

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**AAPI** / An acronym for Asian American and Pacific Islander(s). “API” (Asian-Pacific Islander) can also be used.

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**ABLEISM** / Discrimination in favor of able-bodied people.

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**ABSOLUTE CODE or GOLDEN RULE** / A pledge to not disclose someone’s sexuality without permission.

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**AFAB** / An acronym for “Assigned Female at Birth.” This term is used by a range of people—including transgender, nonbinary, gender nonconforming, and/or intersex individuals—as a way to communicate to others the gender assigned to them at birth (based solely on their sexual anatomy).

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**AMAB** / An acronym for “Assigned Male at Birth.” This term is used by a range of people—including transgender, nonbinary, gender nonconforming, and/or intersex individuals—to communicate to others the gender assigned to them at birth (based solely on their sexual anatomy).

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**BLACK GAY PRIDE** / A movement that empowers the visibility of the Black gay, same gender-loving, and queer community. The terms “Black Pride” and “Black Pride Movement” can also be used.

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**BIPOC** / An acronym for “Black, Indigenous, and people of color”—an inclusive term for supporting people within a community who face marginalization and erasure because of race or ethnicity.

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**CHOSEN NAME** / A name chosen by an individual that differs from their given name at birth. In the LGBTQIA+ community, a chosen name often helps in affirming an individual’s gender identity and expression.

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**CISSEXISM** / The belief that there are only two genders (male and female), that these genders are assigned at birth and are immutable. This belief results in the oppression of gender nonconforming, nonbinary, and transgender people.

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**COERCIVE PASSING** / The coercion of a queer individual by an outside force to pass as or claim a gender or sexual preference that might not align with the individual’s identity.

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**CULTURAL APPROPRIATION** / The adoption of a marginalized culture’s styles, traditions, and/ or words by members of a more dominant culture without permission or acknowledgment of their origin.

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**DEADNAME** / The former name of a transgender, nonbinary, or gender nonconforming person who has changed their name to affirm their gender identity

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**DOXX** / Exposing someone’s personal and/ or confidential information online without permission.

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**EQUALITY** / The quality or state of being equal—having equal rights, opportunities, and status.

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**FULL SPECTRUM** / Total, intergenerational, culturally diverse inclusion within the LGBTQIA+ community across gender and sexuality spectrums. Typically used in the phrase “full spectrum community,” the term is used to create space for marginalized groups within the gay community.

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**GAY-BASHING** / The harassment and mistreatment of LGBTQIA+ people. Verbal, physical, and emotional mistreatment all fall under the umbrella of gay-bashing.

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**HATE CRIMES** / Crimes, typically violent, committed against a particular identity or group because of prejudice.

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**HIJRA** / A third gender specifically identified in the country of India. A person whose identity is neither male nor female, or who is transitioning to another gender.

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**HOMONORMATIVITY** / A term that addresses the problems of privilege and erasure within the LGBTQIA+ community as its members intersect with race, capitalism, sexism, transmisogyny, and cissexism.

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**INTERSECTIONALITY** / The complex way in which varied forms of discrimination overlap or intersect; the importance of focusing on the presence of all marginalized communities within the larger framework of society.

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**INVISIBILITY** / The cultural dismissal of a particular identity or group of people due to a lack of understanding, acceptance, or representation.

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**LATINX** / A gender-neutral, inclusive alternative to Latino or Latina, identifying people of Latin American descent.

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**MARGINALIZE** / To treat as insignificant or less-than within the social hierarchy and give less access to resources and power than the majority.

# DIVERSITY & SENSITIVITY CHART:

**MISGENDER** / To incorrectly use a gendered term or pronoun for someone.

**MISOGYNY** / An extreme dislike, contempt, and/or ingrained prejudice against women and the overall feminine expression. Not limited to cisgender women, misogyny is often directed at trans and/or intersex women as well as effeminate men and other groups.

**MOC** / An abbreviation for a man/men of color, referring to a person who identifies as such.

**MONOSEXISM** / The belief that monosexuality is superior to bisexuality and other non-monosexual orientations.

**NO LABEL** / Describing a person who does not identify with any gender or sexuality orientations.

**PRIDE** / Confidence in one's identity as a lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual, nonbinary, or otherwise non-heteronormative person.

**PRIVILEGE** / A special right or immunity granted to a particular group of people. Cisgender privilege, male privilege, straight privilege, and white privilege are all included.

**POC** / An acronym for "people of color" or "person of color"—an inclusive term for supporting people within a community who face marginalization and erasure because of race or ethnicity.

**QPOC or QTPOC** / An acronym for queer people/person of color or queer trans people/person of color, diverse people who have been marginalized because of race, sex, and gender. This community centers the experiences of its members and provides spaces and language for empowerment.

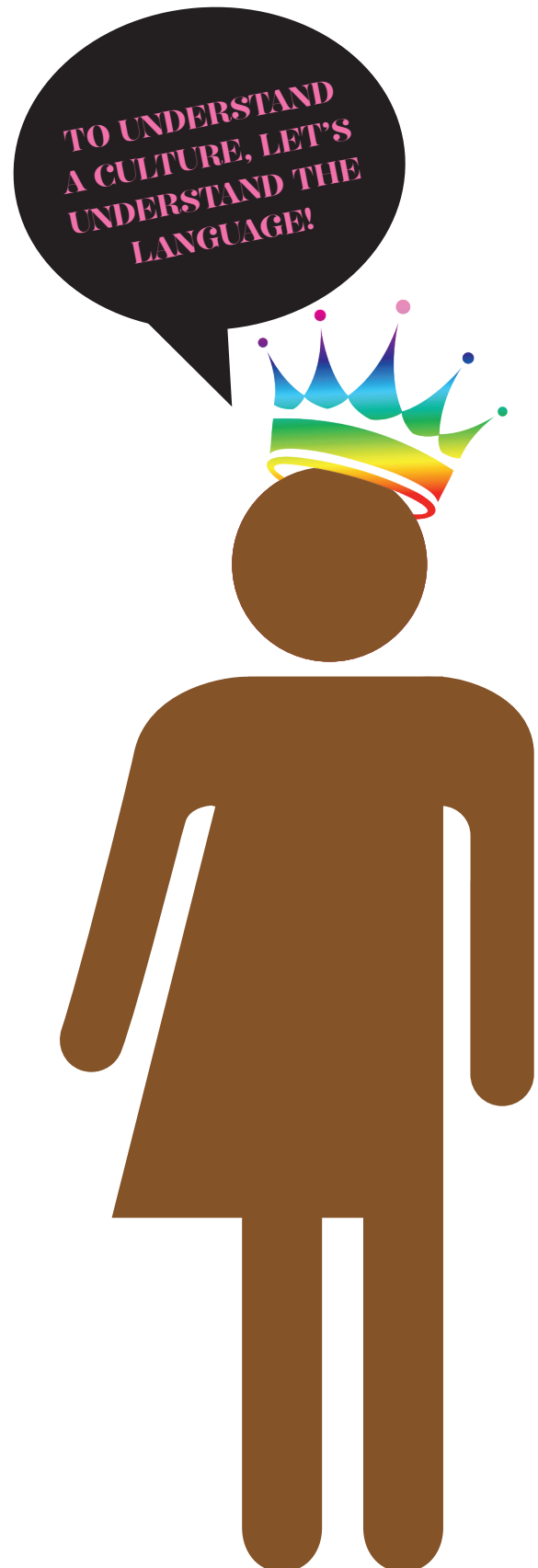
**QWOC or QTWOC** / An inclusive acronym for a queer woman/women of color or queer and transgender women/woman of color, members of a group of diverse women who have traditionally been marginalized because of race, sex, and gender. This community centers the experiences of its members and provides spaces and language for empowerment.

**STEALTH** / Describes a transgender person moving through daily life passing as cisgender. This individual makes a deliberate choice to not disclose to the public their trans identity.

**TWO-SPIRIT OR TWO SPIRIT** / This umbrella term is used to identify the history of gender and sexuality diversity celebrated in Indigenous Native American culture, and that a third gender role is identified and commonly expressed within this culture.

**WOC** / An abbreviation for woman/women of color, referring to a person who identifies as such.

**WOMXN** / An alternate spelling of the word woman, used to fuel the idea that women can exist without "man" or "men."





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
