

## **ABOUT THE ILLUSTRATOR**

Frank Morrison started his journey as a graffiti artist in New Jersey, tagging walls with spray paint. It wasn't until he visited the Louvre Museum in Paris as part of the Sugar Hill Gang's dance entourage that he realized painting was his true creative path. His work has been featured at Art Basel, SCOPE Miami Beach, and Red Dot art fairs, and shown at the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture and the Mason Fine Art Gallery in Atlanta. He is the illustrator of over twenty children's books, including the Coretta Scott King Illustrator Award winners *Standing in the Need of Prayer* and *R-E-S-P-E-C-T*, the Coretta Scott King-John Steptoe Award winner *Jazzy Miz Mozetta*, and the Coretta Scott

King Illustrator Honor Books *Little Melba and Her Big Trombone* and *Let the Children March*. Frank was a Society of Illustrators Original Art Silver Medal Honoree two years in a row, for *The Roots of Rap* and *R-E-S-P-E-C-T*.



### TITLE-SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES

#### HARLEM AT FOUR

- Have you ever been to Harlem? Look at a map of the United States. Harlem is a neighborhood in New York City. New York City is in the state of New York. Can you find New York City on a map?
- Harlem has been the birthplace and home to many amazing people. We meet some of those people in Harlem at Four. Ask a grown-up to help you learn more about the following creatives:
  - Jean-Michel Basquiat
  - Sonia Sanchez
  - Miles Davis
  - John Coltrane

How are you inspired by the creatives you learned about? What creatives are from your country, state, or city/town? What inspires you about the place you live?

#### STANDING IN THE NEED OF PRAYER

- Have you heard of the people featured in this book?
  Be sure to look at the information about each figure in
  the back of the book. ["back matter"
  isn't consumer-friendly].
  What about them do you find
  interesting or inspiring?
- Frank Morrison has painted portraits of various inspirational Black Americans. Who is a Black American that inspires you? Draw a portrait of that person and write a few sentences to explain why they inspire you.


#### **STARSTRUCK**

- With a grown-up's permission, go outside at night and look up at the sky. What do you see? Can you tell the difference between a star and a planet? Do you see something in the sky that you want to learn more about?
- Neil deGrasse Tyson knew he wanted to be an astrophysicist at a very young age. Is there something you want to do or be when you grow up?
- Frank Morrison uses watercolor paint to illustrate the night sky. Create your own night sky using watercolors, paper, and a white crayon. Find a blank piece of white paper (it can be any size). Use a white crayon and draw stars, planets, and comets all over it. The stars can be small dots like in Frank Morrison's illustrations or more like the five-pointed
- star shape you're familiar
  with. Next, use black
  watercolor paint to paint
  the entire paper. Be sure to
  brush over all the stars,
  planets, and other celestial
  bodies you drew. Watch closely
  as the stars slowly appear all
  over the page! Be sure to name
  your newly created galaxy.
