

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING SGRAPHIC NOVELS

Graphic novels as a genre are on the whole more steeped in questions of identity and social emotional issues. This brochure provides some suggestions and activities for a curated selection of graphic novels that have social emotional lessons. Use these activities to not only practice visual literacy, but also to begin conversations around self awareness, social awareness, responsible decision making, self-management, and relationships.

This brochure includes graphic novel titles that address the social and emotional core competencies known as the CASEL 5.




THE CORE COMPETENCIES

These core competencies are used to establish social and emotional learning (SEL) guidelines and standards that articulate what students should know and be able to do to ensure academic success, social and civic engagement, health and wellness, and fulfilling futures. We have suggested titles for each of the CASEL 5 categories, but many of these titles fit into multiple categories.



TEACHING VISUAL LITERACY AND SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

At the beginning of class, show two or three panels from a graphic novel. For each panel, ask students to write about or discuss anything they observe about the character's appearance. Does the characters body language suggest anything about how the character is feeling or how they interact with the world around them?

Turning their attention to the background, ask the students to note the color scheme of the panels they are viewing. Do they think that plays into the mood of the scene? Are the colors the graphic novel artist used bright or dark? Are the characters shrouded in shadow or are the scenes fully lit? What do they think the artist was trying to convey by making these choices? How would changing the color palette change the scene's tone?

Next, look at the position of the characters. Ask students to focus on where the characters are physically placed in the panel. Are they positioned toward the top or closer to the bottom? Perhaps they are in the center? Remind students that the artist makes choices to convey information. What might the artist be attempting to indicate by the placement of the character on the page? For example, placing the main character in the center of the panel as opposed to the corner.

Then look at where the text is placed within the panel. Is the text integrated into the image, or do they exist separately? If they are separated, do you think that enhances the image, or does it take you out of the story? Why do you think the artists may have decided to integrate or separate them?

After you have discussed all the visual elements of the panels, ask students to write their thoughts about how all these stylistic choices express different emotions a character might be feeling through the panels.

ACTIVITY FOR VISUAL LITERACY AND SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

Direct students to create either a happy or sad image using basic shapes and colors. Give them fifteen minutes to create. When time is up, ask volunteers to share their image and have the class share how the picture makes them feel and what stylistic elements make them feel that way. After the class has shared their thoughts, the student can weigh in on why they made certain decisions and what type of image they created.

After a few people have shared their creations, have the students revise their image so that it conveys the opposite emotion, happy pictures should be made sad, and vice versa. What color and or shape changes did students make to express opposite feelings? Have students share their revisions with the class and discuss how the changes they made altered the way the work is perceived. Discuss why.




