



A WORD ON HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH FROM KARLA VALENTI



The theme for this year's Hispanic Heritage month is "Esperanza: A Celebration of Hispanic Heritage and Hope." Surely there is no more fitting theme to embrace in 2021. But what exactly are we celebrating?

The root of "heritage" stems from inheritance, a legacy passed on from generation to generation. In this case, the inheritance is a cultural one, passed on through food and music, fables and myths. It is a gift of history, a wealth of traditions, a bounty of stories. To celebrate Hispanic heritage is to acknowledge the many contributions of the Hispanic and Latinx American experience in shaping the identity of our nation.

As for "hope," that unwavering quality of trust is central to the Hispanic ethos—a lifeline as potent as the blood that courses through our veins.
